AFRICA SOURCING AND FASHION WEEK (ASFW) NAIROBI 2025 CONCLUDES WITH STRONG INTERNATIONAL TURNOUT AND GROWING INDUSTRY IMPACT

Africa Sourcing and Fashion Week (ASFW) Nairobi 2025 has officially wrapped up after three impactful days of business and international collaboration. This year's edition welcomed **3,035 visitors from 55 countries** and hosted **155 exhibitors from 22 countries**, reflecting the growing global importance of East Africa's textile, leather, and fashion industries.

In his remarks, **Skander Negasi**, CEO of Trade and Fairs Group and organizer of ASFW, expressed his optimism: "I am not only proud of having exhibitors from over 20 countries and the overall growth of the event, but even more about the international quality of attendance we have this year. We saw important brands and chains such as Sainsbury's, Calvin Klein, and many others present, which makes me even more confident that ASFW Nairobi will continue to grow stronger in the years ahead."

As part of the European Union (EU)-funded EU–East African Community (EAC) MARKUP II programme, the International Trade Centre (ITC) facilitated the participation of a regional delegation of 17 leather businesses specializing in footwear and accessories from Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, and South Sudan. The delegation also included several business support organizations (BSOs) and key institutional partners.

This initiative created new avenues for business development and provided international exposure for the participating companies.

In addition, ITC, the African Leather and Leather Products Institute (ALLPI) also sponsored eight leather companies to exhibit at ASFW, highlighting the strength and creativity within the region's leather industry. The Ethiopian and Turkish government presented country pavilions with high-end garment for the African and International Market.

With such strong attendance, engagement, and international participation, ASFW Nairobi continues to cement its position as East and Central Africa's leading sourcing platform for the textile, apparel, and leather sectors.
